

Fewer than 1 in 5 receive assistance with an unmet civil legal need




MLP Benefits for Survivors


Survivors report more legal needs than the average low-income household

Access to legal aid can reduce DV and mitigate collateral consequences

Survivors without legal representation are more likely to be later victimized

The two most significant barriers for domestic violence survivors to receive legal aid are inadequate program funding and strict eligibility requirements





Education: Trainings provided to health care partners about potential legal issues of patients

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Screening: An integrated legal needs screening tool identifies unmet legal needs

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Screening: An integrated legal needs screening tool identifies unmet legal needs

Referral: When a legal need is identified, the patient is referred to DMLP (with consent)

Action: Legal team contacts the patient within 48 hours (2 business days) to investigate and begin addressing the legal problems

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
Feedback: Health care partner is informed of legal case outcome (with consent)

I-HELP Legal Screening Tool

Developed by National Center for MLP

Administered by health and social service partners

Identifies common legal issues that impact health and well-being



DV MLP Workflow

- DV provider screens using referral form
- DV provider gives forms to DV MLP staff member
- Forms to CLASI MLP, confirming receipt of referral
- CLASI contacts survivor within 48 hours to provide legal services
- CLASI provide feedback to DV MLP staff member

What if survivor does not meet eligibility or does not consent to referral?



Non Referral Provider Consults

Email to ask a general legal question without providing any identifying information

Interdisciplinary Teamwork

Logistics of creating a partnership

Co-location or separate office space

Name a champion at the provider partner or allow all staff to refer

Legalities: MOUs, protected info/confidentiality

Frequent and effective communication



In 2018, 46% of PFA petitioners in Delaware were successfully granted a PFA order.


CLASI clients were successfully granted a PFA order 61% of the time.

Common Hurdles

Lack of finances to obtain an attorney due to abuse (financial, emotional, etc)



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Limited non-financial resources (transportation, knowledge of legal process, etc)



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Lack of advocacy on the survivors behalf





Impacts of COVID-19

Number and frequency of referrals increased compared to previous quarters.

Hearings and trials continued virtually in a seamless transition.

"Without the partnership with CLASI, I would have never been able to receive representation for my trial against my offender."

"I tried for so long to get help obtaining custody of my 2 young children. My abuser made it nearly impossible. Once I was referred to CLASI through the MLP, they were able to give me the help and confidence I needed to get my kids back."
