

Process:

- 1. CARE Assessment (pre-test)
- 2. Intervention
 - 1. Policy & training recommendations
 - 2. Resources
 - 3. Technical assistance
- 3. CARE Assessment (post-test)
- 4. Placement on CARE online platform
- 5. Ongoing patient feedback through platform



Reproductive Justice Fund

In response to the changing reproductive rights landscape in Texas, the San Antonio City Council developed the Reproductive Justice Fund to address downstream, midstream, and upstream barriers to reproductive and sexual health services.

\$500,000 was awarded to four agencies dedicated to maternal and family health

Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)

The CHIP is the community-wide, collaborative blueprint developed to tackle public health priorities in Bexar County, which encompasses San Antonio.

The Center will serve as backbone support for agencies that align with the CHIP strategies.

Priority Areas:

- Behavior and Mental Wellbeing
- Food Security
- Housing Stability
- Prenatal Care

Key Implementation Strategies:

- Strengthen access to prenatal care
- Expand maternal mental health services
- Improve nutrition & health education
- Address key drivers of health
- Create community incentive programs
