

We knew Louisiana infants have worse outcomes than they should.



- Black infants twice as likely as white infants to die in their fist year of life.
- Very low birthweight (under 3.3lbs) significantly increases mortality risk.
- Chronic conditions before pregnancy dramatically increase the risk of preterm birth and very low birth weight babies.



Big Goal: Reduce infant mortality in New Orleans.







Managing chronic disease before and between pregnancies is complex, expensive, and timeconsuming.



Low-dose aspirin helps reduce the risk of preeclampsia among pregnant women with chronic conditions.







Process goal: reduce preeclampsia by improving rates of low-dose aspirin use when indicated.

- Multilevel intervention for providers, moms, and community organizations
- Grounded in regenerative leadership and building sustainability
- Working across partners (WIC, hospitals, doulas, peers)





How: Interventions across several audiences and environments to carry the message.

Understanding Need and Impact: Leveraging lived experiences and local health data to shape the approach









Where are we now?

- > Southeast Louisiana provider curriculum developed and accreditation in process (building off Low Dose, Big Benefits)
- > Partnerships formed with healthcare systems for curriculum distribution
- > Deepened alignment with community organizations (WIC, primary care, doulas, universities)
- ➤ 125 community surveys completed
- > 15+ Interviews with pharmacists, OBGYNs, and subject matter experts
- ➤ Medicaid claims data analysis begun
- ➤ Public transit and campaign materials developed













Next steps for sustainable impact:

Policy Advocacy

 Working toward pharmacist reimbursement and removing over-thecounter cost barriers

Provider Network Expansion

 Scaling campaign reach to additional clinics and healthcare systems across the region
